

²⁷The LORD is God, and he has given us light.


Bind the festal procession with branches, up to the horns of the altar.







LENTEN BOOK STUDY RESUMES this Tuesday evening with selection #2 from *Listening for God, V. 1:* Frederick Buechner, "The Dwarves in the Stable."

MAUNDY THURSDAY is the first of the three days of the Pascal (Easter) Triduum and marks the night of the Last Supper as told in the Bible. Four young people of St. John's will receive communion for the first time at this service on March 28 at 7 p.m.

GOOD FRIDAY, the second day of the Triduum, is a Christian holiday commemorating of the crucifixion of Jesus and his death at Calvary. Worship on March 29 at 7 p.m. is essentially a continuation of Thursday's service of worship.

EASTER SUNDAY, MARCH 31

We celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. According to the Bible, it marks the third day after Jesus was crucified when he rose from the dead. Easter breakfast (pancakes, fruit, sausages, coffee, juice, milk) will be served from 8-9:30 am; free will donations will go to support Chi Rho Center. Children gather at 9:15 in office lobby for an Easter Egg Hunt. Worship begins at 10.
