Thoughts from Pastor Mark



As I sat in my office in late November, I found myself reflecting on the past year and feeling (as my kids might say) "all the feels" along the wide pendulum of emotions. I felt grateful, glad, even happy for so many things we have accomplished together in the past year. But then I also remembered a few things occurring within our congregation right now

and felt sad, frustrated, and a little anxious (if not fear). What happens if the family I talked to on the phone truly won't ever return to ANY church (let alone ours) ever again because as he said, "We haven't had church for over two years, and now... I dunno... I guess we are discerning whether we really want that for our kids." As hard as that hit me emotionally, I nevertheless <u>truly</u> appreciated his candor and openness. It frightens me to say this, but he's not wrong and he's certainly not alone.

But then I read a devotion from our Advent Devotional written by a member and my heart was refilled with gratitude for their expression of faith and I marveled at the depth of it! Then another family flooded my mind. They are so stressed out and sad... I worry about them. Do they know I love them? Do they feel the sense of hope and expectation the season of Advent brings?

Do I?

Do any of us? Ugh... too many feels... So, I took a break and went up into the sanctuary and prayed. Well, I tried... but my mind was too full of thoughts about those in the hospital, the families of young children who are sated with life stuff, and, and, and, it dawned on me that this list of people IS my prayer. So, I wandered through the dark sanctuary that morning and I prayed for that family, for our congregation, and for you, Dear Reader. After praying about everything that was in my mind, I was moved to hang the Advent wreaths on the pillars and found myself singing the Advent hymn *Rejoice, Rejoice, Believer.* The fourth stanza especially hit home:

Our hope and expectation, O Jesus, now appear Arise, O Sun so longed for, o're this benighted sphere With hearts and hands uplifted, we plead O Lord, to see The day of earth's redemption that sets your people free!

In that moment, standing on the pew with the long rod in my hand placing the wreath on that teeny tiny nail... I felt the Holy Spirit poke me in the soul -- reminding me she's still with me, She's still with those families, and She's still with you, Dear Reader.

Although this world feels gloomy with violence and the threat of more violence around every corner, God is still good and empowering us for good and wondrous things. And God is still acting and loving and blessing and redeeming. That's when my perspective changed and instead of noticing the darkness and shadows in the sanctuary, I noticed instead the sanctuary was GORGEOUSLY lit by the sunrays coming through the Te Deum window in the balcony. And in that moment of singing the words of that hymn, and hanging the wreaths, and seeing the colorful light on the backs of the pews, God gave me solace, and hope, and his love once more.

I pray that you intentionally set aside a moment (even a tiny one) for being still with God; and then listen, watch, and wait. For God is about to act and Christ is coming soon. We are in his Advent.


Messiah Reception



Summary of meeting November 17, 2022



Pastor's Report

New member Sunday, Dec. 4: Alex and Jenessa Gronemeyer, Graham Zima, Edith Bohardt, Annabelle Letourneau.

Need nursery attendants desperately, ask anyone that can pass a background check.

No midweek advent service, devotional instead. No Christmas Day service (Sunday) as decided by council.

Veronica (weekend custodian) is filling in during the week, working quickly and learning. **Need to find a weekend snow-removal person**.

May 2023 St. John's will celebrate 140 years. Need a celebration planning task force.

Treasurer's Report - Monthly & YTD Financials

Checking account balance ~\$41,000.

Child Care and St. John's congregation are on course with budget projections.

Chi Rho is \$32,000 below budget for income and \$9,000 above budget for expenses, which is a \$41,000 departure from budget overall.

Chi Rho: WCC contract in process. WCC not having exclusive use all summer. A family reunion over July 4th weekend will increase income ~\$11,000, and camp won't be vacant. \$85,000-95,000 for WCC contract. Chi Rho pricing rates will be raised for 2023 to motel rates. Booking software is being explored.

A/C: total cost \$69,700. The major portion (~\$60,000) will be paid in December 2022. A/C dedicated funds are \$60,356; put final payment in 2023 budget, or move from Organ fund.

Organ fund Capital campaign; current balance \$95,838. Will need to raise ~\$33,000.

A motion was made to sell Edward Jones stocks/mutual funds and stocks from the Slifer bequest for approximately \$60,000. and move cash into Thrivent Money Market. Money goes for website, new doors, awnings, etc. Also, remainder to pad the rainy-day fund.

The motion passes.

Old Business:

Langer Proposal: Pr. Mark and Steve will work with Ron to revise list of projects. Council will put fee into 2023 budget.

Rustic Lodge Task Force update: Plumbing and electrical needs. Windows need painting. Lutheran Social Services may be able to find an organization to manage the property.

Roof: No new information on possible lawsuit. Exploring other roofing options – metal, asphalt that would facilitate solar panels.

New Business

Jaeden Micco has resigned from Council.

December 15, 5:30pm, event with all staff and council. Council to meet in person in 2023.

Council approves spending \$500 to wire fellowship hall. #MartinLuther is new password for guest Wi-Fi. Wi-Fi access to most of the building now.
