## Thoughts from Our Pastor



For me, December is indeed the most wonderful time of the year, but (sorry Andy Williams) it is <u>not</u> because "there'll be parties for hosting, marshmallows for toasting or caroling out in the snow." And not because "there'll be much mistletoeing" (wait, is that even a word?) nor because "hearts will be glowing when loved ones are near." No, it is the most wonderful time of the year because during the season of Advent we – all of us together — are preparing, anticipating, and a sense of joyful expectation is building within us for The Gift that will be shared at the end of this month.

The season of Advent is especially wonderful when it is juxtaposed over against our culture's assumption that we all have families who resemble the Hallmark Channel's Christmas specials of what they project as "holiday perfection" where everything works out to syrupy, nostalgic, perfection in the end. For many people the counterfeit, saccharin emotional pull of the cultural holiday season serves to deny or silence their own sorrows over family brokenness, or mourning, or loneliness. But our Christian festival of Advent intentionally provides exactly the opposite. Long ago, the Church placed Christmas near the winter solstice because it was (in the northern hemisphere anyway) the season of the longest nights and winter solstice is the dawn of the first day when days lengthen — and the birth of Christ was the birthing of a whole new reality. Advent occurs during the time of year when night lengthens but we also know that a new day is dawning soon, and the birth of Christ – the birth of our salvation occurs during the season of lengthening days – like our hope peace, joy and faith. Moreover, Advent serves us by naming the brokenness, loneliness, mourning, or general sense of loss; and into that emotional truth Advent proclaims each week a message of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love, reminding us that not only are we not alone in our current emotional state, but also that although our sadness might last through the symbolic night our hope, peace, joy and love will come in the morning. Which, by the way, is the reason the symbolic color of the Season was changed to dark blue – to symbolize the winter sky just before the dawn of a new day.

Advent prepares us individually and communally for Christ's birth. Each day we can reflect on the devotion provided by a church member and each week we can gather together to hear God's word read, proclaimed, and sung – all the while we are being preparing, anticipating, and filling with joyful expectation for the birth of the One who is coming and whose Day draws near: Christ Jesus, the Lord. It is because of all of that, Advent is indeed the most wonderful time of the year.

A Blessed Advent to you all!

#### **CROSS+GENERATIONAL MINISTRY**

At this time of the year most of us are busy preparing for the holidays. Asking people what they are wanting for Christmas, and after Christmas some of us start thinking about New Year's Resolutions. For me, I stopped making New Year's resolutions years ago, and started selecting a word for the year. For 2023 my word is Joy, for 2024 my word is hopeful. Hopeful for what is ahead for us as a community of faith.



One of the things I am hopeful for is a growth in our Handbell Choir. Participating in the handbell choir is one of the ways I volunteer my time here at St John's. It is a great group of people, and we are all from different musical backgrounds, yet we all work well together. Playing in the handbell choir is like joining a team. Each person has their bells, but we all work as if we are the same set of hands. We are all connected, it is a musical experience unlike any other.

Now I know you might have some concerns about joining us:

"I have never played handbells before." Start now! Come early to your first rehearsal and get some private coaching.

"I can't read music." We can teach you. We can also color code your music to your bells (In a former church, I once led a group of adults in a handbell choir who couldn't read music. We color coded the notes with the bells. It worked great!)

"It looks like it is complicated." It isn't complicated at all! It looks complicated because there are a lot of moving parts, but we all work together as one set of hands.

"I don't have a lot of time." You don't need much. To participate in handbell choir, we have one rehearsal per month September through May, and we play on one Sunday a month (the Sunday that follows our practice day). I work 62 hours a week and still have time for Handbell Choir, so I know you can have time for it too.

Currently, we have bells that remain in their cases, because we have no one to play them. This limits us in the music that we can play. If we could get more people to join us, think of how much more we could do. We would be able to extend our range and more music would be available to us to play.

In closing, no one asked me to write this. I wrote this because I enjoy playing in the Handbell Choir, and I would like you share in and experience the joy that I do. Please consider joining us. Email Peder if you are interested in doing so. Looking forward to ringing with you in 2024!

#### **COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD**

**St. John's Justice Page Middle School Food Backpack Ministry** provides food-filled backpacks for 20 food-insecure families once a month during the school year. This year there are 3 sets of backpacks – 10 with food that is culturally-appropriate for Latina families, 5 with food that is culturally-appropriate for Somali families, and 5 that are the mix of foods we have provided in past years.

We are looking for volunteers. Please let us know if you are interested in 1 of the 5 following roles:

- 1. Be part of a team of 2-3 people that inventory our food stock and purchase needed culturally-appropriate food items for 10 Latina families every month: 10 one-pound bags of dry black beans, 10 one-pound bags of dry pinto beans, 10 cans enchilada sauce, and 10 cans diced chiles/peppers.
- 2. Be part of a team of 2-3 people that inventory our food stock and purchase the culturally appropriate food items for 5 Somali families every month: 5 cans Halal tuna and 5 bags black-eyed peas.
- 3. Purchase 1 or more of the following items every month for several months or the full year. Depending on the item, this will range from 5-40 items/month. Foods can be ordered online and delivered to church.
  - 20 15 oz. cans diced tomatoes
  - 20 packs of spaghetti
  - 20 24 oz. non-glass (plastic) marinara pasta sauce
  - 20 1-pound bags brown rice
  - 40 boxes macaroni and cheese
  - 20 cans fruit
  - 20 cans vegetables
  - 40 packs of Ramen (chicken)
  - 5 cans stew/hearty soup
  - 5 cans beef ravioli
  - 20 jars (16-oz) peanut butter
  - 20 boxes of granola bars
  - 200 fruit snack pouches (10 per backpack)
- 4. Lead packing 2 or more times per year. We will train you before you are in charge. Packing happens on these Sundays after worship, during fellowship hour:
  - Dec. 10, Jan. 14, Feb. 11, March 17, April 14, May 12, and June 9.
- 5. Transport backpacks to Justice Page School 2 or more times/year. Deliveries are one Thursday per month between 8:30-9:00AM:
  - Dec. 14, Jan. 18, Feb. 15, March 21, April 18, May 16, and June 13.





#### **GIVING TREE 2023**

# St. John's Congregation Council Minutes Summary November 19, 2023



#### Pastor's Report:

- Our goal this year for the Church should be New Life, New Vitality, New Things. We need to be evangelists and reach out to the community.
- Reach out to childcare parents through welcoming events
- Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices is meeting at St. John"s Tuesday.
- Chi Rho finished and field seeded. Wayzata Church happy and will be there through July 22.
- Pledge cards total of \$62,310 to date is high for November in recent years.
- Pastor proposed a staff appreciation be planned.

#### Treasurer's Report:

- Church having a deficit of \$139,734 is expected since we passed a deficit budget for 2023.
- Chi Rho summer programs have ended and would like to fill the camp with winter retreats
- Pastor moved we have two task forces. One to help grow the congregation and one to figure out how to pay for the roof. Motion passed.

<u>Ministry Team Reports</u> were received from CAN, Cross+Generational and Worship committees. No council action needed.

#### Old Business:

- Organ claim money received and money raised will be put towards roof replacement with donors' approval.
- Look into putting Holden bequest money towards new signage.

#### New Business:

- Council voted that the state required Sick and Safe Time policy be added to part-time personnel policy beginning January 1, 2024.
- Annual Congregational Budget meeting will take place January 28, 2024.
- Council voted to welcome an Engen organ to be housed at St. John's.
- Lois Mae Andersen left an undesignated bequest of \$30,000 to the Church.
- Pastor talking to Church Mutual about new property insurance for January 1, 2024
- Pastor moved to have a soft external audit in 2024. Motion passed.

Pledge update as of publication: 30 pledges at \$88,341


