New Music Series Artistic Director Named

St. John's Music Series is pleased to welcome Brian Schmidt as Artistic Director. Brian will lead the Oratorio Chorus in its 2023 'Messiah' season and is looking forward to working with the Music Series committee.

Brian A. Schmidt is a choral conductor with a twenty-year career focused on developing meaningful musical experiences for audiences and artists alike. Schmidt has a passion for championing unsung musical heroes past and present and is known for presenting modern premieres of rarely heard and newly discovered composers. Schmidt was founder and conductor of the South



Dakota Chorale, leading the development of a choir that released several acclaimed recordings which Gramophone Magazine described as "luminous," Audiophile Audition called "stunning," and the ensemble was hailed as "one of the most exciting choral ensembles in America" by Sounds Choral (WWFM). His discography includes recordings found on Pentatone, MSR Classics, Gothic Records, and Oxford University Press Music.

Previously, he was conductor of the Duke Vespers Ensemble at Duke Chapel, where he also founded both a monthly Bach Cantata Series and Cappella Baroque, a professional period-instrument orchestra specializing in early music. He also served at Baylor University where he conducted the top mixed choirs and led the graduate program in choral conducting.

Schmidt studied choral music at South Dakota State University and holds a master's degree and doctorate of music arts in choral conducting at the University of North Texas.





scenes acts of quiet giving in partnership with her husband Steve. THANK YOU both for the wisdom and commitment with which you care for and with this church community.

Pastor's report

Reconciling in Christ Welcome Statement/Statement of Inclusion

Anne Nervig presented the new language recommended by RIC that expands the statement into a call for action on racial equity and anti-racism. (changes in red)

We affirm that this reconciliation extends to people of all gender identities, gender expressions and sexual orientations. We affirm a commitment toward the work on racial equity and anti-racism. We welcome members of the LGBTQIA+ community as well as those who may have been excluded because of other human distinctions.

Discussion:

The writers of our unique RIC statement already included a broad covering: "as well as those who may have been excluded because of other human distinctions"

St. John's already has a commitment toward work on racial equity and anti-racism in our mission statement.

An RIC representative will be invited to St. John's to explain the request for this addition.

Changing the RIC statement has been tabled for further discussion.

A 1-minute video about St. John's achievements was shown.

Oly Stromberg moved to adjourn the meeting. Jeanne Tuvey seconded the motion.

All in favor, the meeting was adjourned at 11:50 a.m.
