RECONCILING IN CHRIST

Celebrating and caring for all people.

The purpose of the Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Program is to ensure the welcome, inclusion, celebration, and advocacy for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions; work for racial equity and commit to anti-racist work and support the national program. Since 1983, the RIC program has been a public way for faith communities to see, name, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender expressions in the Lutheran church. Over time, those commitments have expanded as we continue to live into our values.

Part of the process toward becoming a Reconciling in Christ congregation in 2019 was the drafting of a WELCOME STATEMENT that states an intentional welcome to people of "**all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions**" or "**LGBTQIA+ people.**" Recognizing that injustices have occurred in the name of faith, Reconciling Works encourages congregations to now also specifically name our commitment to "**racial equity**" or "**anti-racism**" in our welcome statement. Therefore, the recommended wording of St. John's unique statement of welcome is as follows:

St. John's is a Reconciling in Christ congregation that celebrates and cares for all people. As followers of Christ, who calls us to reconciliation and wholeness through baptism, the members of St John's Lutheran Church welcome all who are seeking God. We affirm that this reconciliation extends to people of all gender identities, gender expressions and sexual orientations. We affirm a commitment toward the work on racial equity and anti-racism. We welcome members of the LGBTQIA+ community as well as those who may have been excluded because of other human distinctions. We strive to live as a welcoming people in our life together and our outreach to the community. Our doors are open. Come as you are. You belong.

The recommended revised statement will be presented at our June annual meeting for congregational consideration and approval. Our welcome statement is posted at church, included in all publications and on our website. Another public expression of specific welcome is our display of the flags in rainbow colors on our church lawn each year during the month of June. The colors symbolize the diversity of the LGBT community and the spectrum of human sexuality and gender. One may note that the RIC logo itself has been expanded to more fully represent the range of diversity in community.

- RIC Welcome Statement Revision memorialize (council is asking congregation to approve the amended RIC welcome statement) at annual meeting.

New Business:

<u>Motion made</u> to take \$100,000 from 3 separate accounts (remaining ~\$12k from MIF, ~\$88k ERC, and existing ~\$400 CD) and combine to purchase an 11-month CD from Huntington Bank at 5%. Motion seconded; following discussion, motion passed.
