Thoughts from Pastor Mark

Lent: A Season for Tending and Nurturing our Faith



The season of Lent is the 40-day season within our church year when each disciple of Jesus is invited and encouraged to purposefully reflect upon their relationship with God through Christ Jesus. Each of us already has a relationship with Christ. Lent provides for us a liturgical season to tend that relationship and do what we need to mature it/deepen it/grow it.

<u>Note</u>: There is no expectation or prerequisite needed for having a relationship with God through Christ Jesus. Instead, Lent provides us the 40-day opportunity to give thanks for and simultaneously respond to the relationship we already have with Christ, growing into it and deepening it for the sake of our neighbor.

The New Testament is riddled with this message to grow our faith/relationship with Christ. Here are but three examples:

- **2 Peter 3:18:** But <u>grow</u> in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen
- **1 Peter 2: 1-2** Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. ² Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may <u>arow up</u> in your salvation, ³ now that you have tasted that the Lord is good.
- **Ephesians 4: 14-15** ¹⁴ We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming; ¹⁵ but speaking the truth in love, we must <u>grow up</u> in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶ from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's <u>growth in building itself</u> up in love.

I hope that you take hold of this Season of Lent and make it work for you. I pray that you are able to attend the Lutheranism 101 sessions or Thursday's Holy Conversations. Or is there something else I could arrange that would be helpful for you? I pray you resume attending weekly Sunday worship or attend Lenten Wednesday evening worship.

Perhaps you already do all those things, but now you might consider starting your own schedule of daily Bible reading or beginning the practice of prayers prior to meals, or bedside prayers in morning or night, or both. I sincerely hope that this season of Lent will be a moment for you to kickstart/restart/or refresh your growth in Christ and your relationship with him.

His title is Congregational Organizer of Environmental Justice, Minneapolis Area Synod. There were speakers on various topics including current state and local legislation needing to be passed. Stressed was the importance of taking care of our neighbors. Solutions for cleaner air should be for the rich and poor alike.

Our Tangletown Environmental Committee is committed to these same goals. Presently they are working toward incentivizing neighbors to install solar panels on their roof as a way to create a more sustainable energy future.
