Thoughts from Our Pastor



Just a quick glance through the pages of this month's edition of *The Messenger* and you can see that our church ministry is humming along. There are so many wonderful things happening among us and through us: Edith's weekly book study, Wednesday Eve Lenten Worship, Minneapolis Brass Concert on March 9, hosting the Red Cross blood drive on March 25, Game Night on March 14th, packing of food backpacks on the 17th, the Sanctuary Spruce Up on March 23, ordering Easter plants, the organ console has returned to the sanctuary and will be played on Palm Sunday, and our festive worship celebrations of Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter. Our in-person attendance is back to levels we haven't seen since pre-covid while our online viewers continue to hold steady.

Gathering for pizza suppers then Holden Evening Prayer at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd for Lent has been a wonderful success. It's been wonderful to hear these creative sermons as well as the beautiful liturgy sung by their and our musicians. Just a reminder that we will continue throughout Lent to hold those Wednesday services at LCGS at 7PM, but Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship services will be at St. John's at 7PM.

Thank you all very much for your continued involvement and support to this ministry we share.

St. John's is one approximately 135 congregations which comprise the Minneapolis Area Synod. The Synodical Bishop is selected at Synod Assembly every six years through a very public discernment or call process. This year the synod met in conferences and were invited to put forth 3 names of people rostered in the ELCA (nationwide) as pastors of Word and Sacrament ministry. Then those people were contacted by the Synodical Vice President Ms. Felecia Boone to inquire whether those candidates were willing to proceed in the call process. But also, at the Synod Assembly's initial meeting there will be a space for the Voting Members to write anyone's name on the line. Then the synod assembly prays, and we cast a ballot in discernment of what the Holy Spirit is nudging us to do. If someone receives 75% of the vote on this first round, we have elected a Bishop. If not, we go to round 2 which limits the candidates to the top seven names and takes 66.7% of the votes cast to be selected as Bishop. These ballots continue until we whittle down the number to 1. It is a fascinating process.

This year my name was put forward as one of the 12 candidates for bishop of the Minneapolis Area Synod. I have no doubt that God is up to something here, but I do not presume to be called to serve as Bishop. If I am called, I will serve, but if I am not called, I will continue to serve you and continue in our ministry to lengthen the reach of God's inclusive love and grow this congregation.

Thank you very much for the honor of continuing as your pastor.

Moment of Generosity: This month we give thanks and our appreciation to Mark Nervig who was willing to serve as St. John's Synod Assembly Voting Member. Mark and Pastor Mark were present at the Pre-Assembly gathering on February 10 where names of potential candidates for Bishop were compiled and put forward. Mark and Pastor Mark will also be present May 2-4 as this synod does its business and elects a new Bishop.

CROSS+GENERATIONAL MINISTRY

WHERE DO YOU LISTEN FOR GOD?

As I look at the date today, it is the first gathering of the Lenten Book Study Group. We are reading "Listening for God Volume 1," a collection of short stories or essays in which we are encouraged to get out of our comfort zone and listen for God where we might have never thought of before. I know that I will be stretched but also know that it will be well worth it.

But I cannot help thinking, "Where do I listen for God?" If I am being fully transparent, I admit that I have those days where it is all I can do to pray my prayer beads, and I do not take time for God. I do however hear God through the Holy Spirit at work, nudging me when I need it. Being that still small voice that tells me, "You've got this" or "It is going to turn out better than you think it will." This has happened to me a few times since coming here to St John's, and just so you know: that still small voice with nudge has been right **every** time.

This week I will talk to the children about our God being the God of second chances. When we mess up, we can let God know we are sorry, and God will give us a second chance, and a third, and many more after that. And I wonder to myself how can I **not** be available for God when I have been given multiple chances to do better?

I like to sit in the sanctuary after everyone has left and sit quietly and listen. I listen to Pr. Mark's sermons, often with a pen or pew pencil in my hand, so I can take notes. I did pay attention in my Bible classes, but I can still hear something I never knew or thought of before, especially when he mentions words and definitions from the Greek or Hebrew as those were not required courses for me. I listen when we have conversations in Grace Place. I marvel at the conversations our children have. They are very smart. Parents: you are doing a FANTASTIC job!

While I do listen for God inside the church building, I need to listen for God outside of the church building. The Lenten Book Study is a good place to start. We do have three extra books. If you would like to join us, simply let me know. After our first session I am excited to engage in more conversations. This Lenten season is my season to stretch. To listen for God in new ways and in unfamiliar places.

Perhaps this Lenten season is also your time to stretch. I have an invitation for you: in the back of the sanctuary in the Grace Space area will be a large piece of tagboard hung up. On it will be written "I Listen for God..."

Then in the empty space, I would like you to let others know where you listen for God. I will have some assorted post it notes and some markers for you to use. It is my hope that we will learn together where we can listen for God.



ADMINISTRATION

Council Highlights St. John's Congregation Council February 18, 2024



Pastor's Report including Financials:

- The Church received 435K ERC Employee Retention Credit money during covid. Of that 235K remains.
 100K of it has been transferred from ERC to the checking account to cover the negative budget.
- Pastor is very pleased with the new people attending worship, making special note of childcare parents involved. Edith will continue to occasionally offer a morning welcome table with coffee and donuts for childcare parents, the next being on March 12th.
- Edith's many activities such as Shrove Tuesday with over 30 in attendance have been a success. The Church is in a good welcoming position. We will continue with outdoor events for the community during the summer months to show our hospitality.
- Pastor announced he is on the list nominated for bishop. He explained the timeline and how the process works. He hopes to have the opportunity to voice his ideas the direction the synod should go in the future to be a resource center for help for all congregations. From 2005 until now, the Minneapolis area synod has gone from 189 to 139 congregations.

Ministry Team Reports:

- Reports have been received from CAN, Cross+Generational, Music Series, and Worship. No Council action requested. Only a note that volunteers are needed for the Cross+Generational Treat & Meet events.

Old Business:

- Roof legal update Brenda Sauro is waiting to hear back from Guide One after submitting forensic information and encouraging a meeting before moving to sue. Legal fees have been taken out of the roof fund as approved.
- Pastor moved and Deborah seconded that the Holden money assigned to the roof be changed to Chi Rho for equipment. Chi Rho is in need of a UTV vehicle and possibly a golf cart. The first half of the Holden money remains the same, designated to Church cameras. Motion passed.

New Business:

- Two computers were purchased. Dave Helm needed a desktop and Ann a laptop.
- The Church is looking into new ways for members to contribute to the Church while in attendance such as the Venmo app or a QR Code. More research needed.
- Diane will be invited to come to Council and explain her vision as to how the Lounge can be updated to a more modern Resource Center. Grant money will be needed.

Meeting was adjourned with prayer.


