Minneapolis Area Synod's Bishop-elect: the Rev. Jen Nagel

Following an intense discernment process over the past few months, Rev. Nagel was selected on May 4 by the synod assembly on the 5th voting ballot from among 12 candidates. Currently she serves as lead pastor of University Lutheran Church of Hope in Minneapolis.



Thoughts from Our Pastor

April was, speaking just for me, exhausting! Between a medical procedure for a 9mm kidney stone lodged in my left ureter and the (very) public call process for Minneapolis Area Synod I'm not sure which was more uncomfortable.

Having my name put forward and getting far enough through the process to be able to address the Assembly was a profound honor. The other nine candidates are some remarkably talented people, and I am truly proud to have gotten to know each of them. The one big thing I learned was just how immensely heavy is

the Office of Bishop. I have a much deeper appreciation for the women and men who have served or are serving as a Bishop.

Thank you to all of you who were so supportive of me through that process. I know the emotional toll it took on some of you, too. Together we can be grateful to have such a talented and faithful Bishop-elect in Pastor Jen Nagel. She will take office in August and her formal worship service of installation will be open to the public and held at Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis on September 21st.

While there is much in the world to be concerned about, there are also many things worth celebrating: many will be busy attending graduation parties and other celebrations, and my own grandson Arthur is getting baptized on May 12 at Farmington Lutheran Church! It is important to celebrate these milestones – especially during anxious times – because the world needs to hear of the moments of joy despite the moments of angst. It is the resurrection of Christ which provides life to us in the midst of death, hope in the midst of despair, and faith when all seems lost.

Take good care of you. Get the rest you need and be gentle with yourselves. You are worth it.




TUESDAY NIGHT BOOK STUDY: 'LISTENING FOR GOD'

Community and Neighborhood Ministry Update

Highlights of our April meeting with Justice Page Middle School social workers and an English Language Learner teacher.

Review of the 2023-24 school year food Backpack Ministry.

20 backpacks per month were distributed to HHM (Homeless and Highly Mobile) families. There was an average of 30 HHM families at any given time. Next year there may be more, but time will tell. One to two new HHM families arrive each week. Packing of Food Backpacks

Currently the food content of the backpacks is motivating the kids to take them home, ask for them, and meet the diverse cultural needs. We do not anticipate any changes in the food items next school year.

No summer programming that would require food support is happening at Justice Page and social workers will not be present at school this summer. No food will be delivered in July and August. The food delivery will resume in September.

As of now, 20 backpacks seem to be a good number for both St. John's Church and the social workers to support. However, a need for additional food exists. This can be at least partially met through donating food to the Justice Page food pantry. As such, instead of increasing the number of backpacks per month, delivery of tubs of dry food goods for the pantry would be appreciated. Even the tubs are needed to keep mice out of the food in storage at Justice Page due to the age of the building.

Thank you for supporting this ministry financially so that we can purchase food items for May and June.

Faith Practices & Neighboring Practices (FPNP)

Participants of 16 congregations in Northwest, Southwest, and North Minneapolis Area synod cohorts will gather on May 18, 2024, for a FPNP Spring Retreat at Zion Lutheran in Anoka. This will be an opportunity to connect with fellow cohorts and plan for our Neighborhood Listening Projects over the summer. The goal of these Projects is

- 1) To establish and building relationships with neighbors.
- 1) To learn about the things that impact your neighborhood and community.
- 1) To experiment and develop sustained neighboring practices in your neighborhood.
- 2) To practice and gain confidence in 1:1 skill.
- To practice and gain confidence in group spiritual practice.

FPNP is a collaborative learning process of simple (though not always easy to begin) practices that are meant to help build community and expand our awareness of God's activity in the places where we have been called to live. Paying attention to the gifts and strengths of our community members and inviting them to share their gifts is a good first step to building authentic relationships and connecting across differences. Ask someone "What are you good at or passionate about?" and expect to hear a story or two!

Team members from St. John's are Edith Bohardt, Andy Dosdall, Ellen Dosdall, Deborah Dunham, Ann Paulson and Pastor Mark. We'll be meeting as a team on Wednesday, May 8 for reflection and review. If

- Repowered Electronics Recycling Facility Tour on April 20: Repowered is a nonprofit social enterprise and leader in electronics recycling, secure data destruction, and quality refurbished tech.
