Thoughts from Pastor Mark



This fall has been remarkable. In September and October we started to see more people return to regular in-person worship – many brought with them new faces of children who have been added to their family since last we had seen each other. Sunday School is regularly meeting on Sundays and the very moment we can hire Nursery attendants that will also be made available for

those who would choose it. But what FUN it has been to hear the sounds of young ones in worship once again!

The Lutheranism 101 sessions I have been hosting have been, for me at least, an absolute blast. Thank you for you, confirmation parents, who asked for more content and for attending with your confirmand. I *love* the fact that parents and child are there together and many other members and/or friends are attending as well. It's been fun and you have kept me on my toes, for sure!

It has been a joy for me and the Worship Committee to hear from so many of you that you are enjoying the Narrative Lectionary. Granted this is a <u>big</u> change (which, admittedly, not everyone appreciates), but the Worship Committee first suggested and then implemented the change for a few reasons, 1) so that we could hear once again some of those old Bible stories we have not heard in so many years, 2) so that we might grow in our biblical literacy, and 3) so that we experience the Bible as one story of God's redemption of humanity. I can still recall from several years ago Warner Northrup's face upon singing "O Come, O Come, Immanuel" in Advent and he suddenly knew what the lyrics "O Come, O Key of David, Come" meant! That was a huge moment for Warner. That type of experience is exactly what I do hope and pray the Narrative Lectionary might have on you: when the specific Bible chapter and verse or the lyric of a hymn ***suddenly*** makes sense or the story has a deeper context for you, sometime within this year.

This month: November marks a moment when much of our life together pivots for three reasons:

- our country will be making decisions regarding our elected law and policy makers. As Lutheran Christians it is our duty to be in the world and participate in our civic duties. So be sure to vote! And,
- 2) the change of season is more of a leap from that autumnal feel to the more crisp, winter-like days. And,
- 3) in our life together as St. John's Lutheran Church, November is the grand finale to our liturgical year, culminating in an entire month-long recognition of all the generosity given and received by so many.
 - a. All Saints Sunday starts the month by giving thanks to God for all the saints who have lived generous lives among us.
 - b. On Sunday, November 20 we will, as a whole congregation, not only lean into the year 2023 with our pledges of financial generosity and our contributions of time, but also celebrate the sovereignty of the resurrected Christ on Christ the King Sunday – the final Sunday of the liturgical year.
 - c. On Thanksgiving Eve, Wednesday November 23, we will gather for worship to give God thanks and praise for God's gifts of crops and grain, waters and streams, you and me, and indeed all that God has made and given to us to steward.
 - d. Then on the final Sunday of November we start a new liturgical year as the first Sunday of Advent and begin celebration and anticipation of the birth of Christ.

Thankful for you and all you continue to do in/with/ and under your faith, *Pastor Mark*

THE GIVING TREE 2022

Dear St. John's Families,

This is our 24th year of the GIVING TREE! St. John's Child Care Center teams with St. John's church members on this project to multiply our impact on the community. We hope to help our children and all who participate realize the importance of helping others in need.

Justice Page Middle School is the local school that we support. Families have been identified by school social workers as "highly mobile/at risk". Our primary goal is to provide 20 or more families with \$50 in gift cards. Gift cards meet broader needs to include items such food, hygiene items, diapers, formula, etc. Clothing needs identified: gray or black sweatpants for middle school boys (boy's size large or men's size small), and gray or black leggings (women's sizes medium, large and XXL).

Gift cards to Walmart, CUB and Target cards in \$25 dollar amount are suggested. Donations can be dropped off at the church office. There will be a tub just inside our Nicollet entry door to drop off clothing items.



Performance dates are: Saturday, December 10, 7 p.m. and


Sunday, December 11, 4 p.m.

Treasurer's Report: Monthly & YTD Financials
\$50,000 in checking.
Late summer checking account dips were covered by borrowing from Organ and A/C funds. End of September \$75,000 actual deficit. \$20,000 worse than budgeted. Chi Rho has net loss of
\$34,000. Childcare and giving are as expected. 2023 Budget – in process. Council will vote on budget in November.
Need to focus on revenue generation in 2023. Pr. Mark wants to grow our congregation so that the
membership- supports operations in Minneapolis campus.

Rustic Lodge Task Force: extensive plumbing is needed to bring the duplex up to code.

Guide One insurance claim (roof): St. John's claim was denied by Guide One. Next step is to gather information and support for our case before deciding to move forward with legal claim.
