Thoughts from Our Pastor



All Saints Sunday, Pledge Card Sunday, Thanksgiving, and Christ the King Sunday all occur in this single month and it's a lot. It's a lot of choir anthems to rehearse, bells anthems to practice, backpacks to shop for, pack and deliver, prelude and postludes to prepare, sermons to write, bulletins to create, and décor to change. But it is also a very emotionally charged time for all of us. I am hearing many wonder how to keep it all together.

Remember the game Trivial pursuit? The piece you moved around the board was a circle with 6 empty pie shaped slots. The goal of the game was to travel around the board, getting correct answers to each of the 6 genre of questions which would earn you a pie wedge that you would put into your piece. When

your piece was full of 6 different pie wedges, then you traveled to the center to answer one last question. If you got it right, you win. If not, you'd try again.

I think of this game every time I hear someone authentically lament, "I just can't fit it all in" or "I don't have time for church" or "Pastor, I am so tired... I just can't" or "church isn't working for my family right now." I think in these moments people are so authentically overwhelmed by stuff in life that they have begun to think of their faith as merely one of the pie wedges; like tending to their faith is yet another thing they need to do, yet they know they do not have the bandwidth to do anything about it. When in fact, because faith is a gift from God in Christ Jesus, faith is NOT the pie wedge, but the whole round piece that holds together every pie wedge of our lives.



What's more, God does not expect us to have it all correct before we move on to the next genre. God does not expect us to get it right in order to "win." God does not even expect us to have the energy to do anything about it – which is why God... saves... us. God knows we struggle which is why Jesus' ministry was to build community amid the suffering and struggle. We need each other when life piles up. The Church – the community of Jesus followers – EXISTS to provide the net when we fall, to extend the hand when we stumble, to reach out with a healing hand when we are wounded – physically or otherwise. When you cannot believe it, come and just let us speak to you the words of the Good News in Jesus.

Please hear me: I encourage you, when you feel pulled thin and there is nothing left to give, come to church and be amongst the people to whom you belong. When you feel as though life has become insurmountable, come to church where you will meet the resurrected Christ in both sacraments and in the fellowship of the saints gathered. When you feel like maybe you or your family will be a nuisance to the church, COME! And let this community of people love you and SHOW you that they understand.

In these extremely trying moments of life,

PLEASE, do not quit on your faith but rely more fully on it.

PLEASE, do not let your doubts or questions obscure God's clear love of you.

And please DO remember that even when we have our moments of doubt, skepticism, or even cynicism, whether it be generally in God or more specifically in Jesus, or the church, or whatever... God never ever loses faith in you nor ever stops loving you. In fact, God knows our faith falters and that life piles up. That's why God gave us a savior in the first place. Jesus the Christ is that savior. THAT is the Gospel on which we ALL must depend. I know I do.

Edith: How do you like having a groundhog and a pack rat for siblings?

Edith: I am sure they are okay with it. As John Philip reminded us in his interview with me last month, none of us are perfect, but we are all children of God and God loves us even if we snort in our sleep.

Magda Pigtunia: That is wonderful news!

Edith: Yes, it is. Well, our time is up. Was this interview as fun as you

thought it would be?

Magda Pigtunia: It was way more fun!




COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD

St. John's Justice Page Middle School Food Backpack Ministry provides food-filled backpacks for 20 food-insecure families once a month during the school year. This year there are 3 sets of backpacks – 10 with food that is culturally-appropriate for Latina families, 5 with food that is culturally-appropriate for Somali families, and 5 that are the mix of foods we have provided in past years.

We are looking for volunteers. Please let us know if you are interested in 1 of the 5 following roles:

- 1. Be part of a team of 2-3 people that inventory our food stock and purchase needed culturally-appropriate food items for 10 Latina families every month: 10 one-pound bags of dry black beans, 10 one-pound bags of dry pinto beans, 10 cans of chipotles in adobo sauce, 10 cans enchilada sauce, and 10 cans diced chiles/peppers.
- 2. Be part of a team of 2-3 people that inventory our food stock and purchase the culturally appropriate food items for 5 Somali families every month: 5 cans Halal tuna, 5 bags black-eyed peas, and 5 bags fava beans.
- 3. Purchase 1 or more of the following items every month for several months or the full year. Depending on the item, this will range from 5-40 items/month. Foods can be ordered online and delivered to church.
 - 20 15 oz. cans diced tomatoes
 - 20 packs of spaghetti
 - 20 24 oz. non-glass (plastic) marinara pasta sauce
 - 20 1-pound bags brown rice
 - 40 boxes macaroni and cheese
 - 20 cans fruit
 - 20 cans vegetables
 - 40 packs of Ramen (chicken)
 - 5 cans stew/hearty soup
 - 5 cans beef ravioli
 - 20 jars (16-oz) peanut butter
 - 40 10-ounce Sunny-D juice bottles/pouches
 - 20 boxes of granola bars
 - 40 individually wrapped cookie snack packs
 - 200 fruit snack pouches (10 per backpack)





5. Transport backpacks to Justice Page School 2 or more times/year. Deliveries are one Thursday per month between 8:30-9:00AM:

Nov. 16, Dec. 14, Jan. 18, Feb. 15, March 21, April 18, May 16, and June 13.




GIVING TREE 2023

St. John's Congregation Council Meeting Highlights October 8, 2023

Treasurer's Report:

JoAnn pointed out that cash on hand was a \$25,758 deficit. Regular contributions continue to be down and hope is to improve now that summer months are over. Fortunately, there is money to pay the bills. We have not spent and are holding ERC and beguest funds.

Pastor's Report:

- Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices had its first retreat with sixteen congregations (three cohorts). Results were positive for Pastor and Deborah. Pastor believes it's the "right thing at the right time for our congregation."
- Graham Zima has tendered his resignation. He will remain an active member. A "thank you" is being planned for Nov. 5.
- The administration committee proposed increasing Mathew Tiede's hours to add "marketing online" for St. Johns. Richfield Lutheran Church is also interested in marketing online and Jennifer will help Pastor write a description of that position.
- Chi Rho is in good shape and Pastor will be meeting soon with Wayzata to discuss next summer.

Ministry Team Reports: Received from the Community and Neighborhood Ministry Team, Worship Committee, and the Cross+Generational Ministry. Chi Rho sent an email with pictures of work. No Council action needed.

Old Business:

- Good news Organ insurance claim will be going through. Details not available yet.
- Roof insurance claim: We have been advised to sue. Council decided to move forward in considering suing.
- Discussed sharing a Thanksgiving service with Richfield Lutheran Church. Because of no agreement on date and time, it was tabled until next month.

New Business:

- Pledge Card/Stewardship Sunday will be November 12th.
- Budgets will be coming in. Pastor will talk to David about budgeting for an audit.
- Holden beguest decisions tabled until next month.
- Need for a Communications team was tabled until next month.

Pastor moved to adjourn. Meeting was seconded, passed, and adjourned with prayer.
