Thoughts from Pastor Mark



St. John's was organized on May 29, 1883 with Pastor Trabert and just seven (7!) charter members. September 2023 is the 140th start to a "program year." Change over the past 140 years has been a constant: waxing and waning in the number of members, its physical location (Downtown Minneapolis, 17th and Chicago, to 49th and Nicollet), and upon its final move it merged with St. James Lutheran Church and changed its name from St. John's English Evangelical Lutheran Church to St. John's Lutheran Church, Washburn Park.

An ironic cliché offers that "change is the only constant." Perhaps it is correct! We can read about our congregation's enormous changes over the past 140 years in Dr. Doris Flesner's book *Mother Church of English Lutheranism in the Northwest: St. John's Lutheran Church, Washburn Park*, but we have also experienced significant changes in just the past 5 years. And still with all those changes constantly occurring there are things happening that have not and will not change: we still hold weekly worship, we provide a deeply valued sense of welcoming hospitality, we continue to do our part to address the issue of food insecurity, and we together proclaim in unison that Christ is risen and continues to divinely love all people in our world.

One of the ways we will learn how to engage in these changes is through the Minneapolis Area Synod's sponsored program called ***Faith Practices & Neighboring Practices: Renewing Congregational Imagination*** (or FPNP for short). It is a two-year learning community for congregations in the Minneapolis Area Synod. The FPNP leadership believes that vital congregations take seriously the small simple practices that build community, cultivate mutual relationships, and expand our awareness of God's activity in the places where we have been called to live. FPNP leadership guides cohorts of congregations (4-5 congregations per cohort) through a learning process focused on collaborative learning, community building, and spiritual practice. As a whole congregation, we'll experiment with practices in our own community to build authentic relationships with neighbors, connect across difference, and engage contemplative spirituality. The practices are grounded in asset-based community development, intentional simplicity, and contemplative spiritual traditions. Each month, the cohorts meet to process and support one another's work, explore new practices, and build meaningful relationships. We have been placed within a cohort comprised of Lutheran Church of Christ the Redeemer, Holy Cross Lutheran Church, Bread of Life Deaf Lutheran Church, and St Luke's Lutheran of Bloomington. This is new. It is a change. And it is exciting!

As we embark on our 140th "program year," let us be mindful of all that has changed, yet also confidently lean into the changes that are likely yet to come—knowing that whatever change comes, God is nevertheless still present with and among us and calling us forward into the future God prepares for us.

CROSS+GENERATIONAL MINISTRY

WHAT I DID ON MY SUMMER VACATION

Those dreaded words I did not like to hear when I headed back to school each year. The first words were “welcome back!” Then it was: “What did you do this summer?” Neither of my parents drove, so I never experienced the family pile-in-the-car and travel to state parks and /or monuments, like many of my friends did growing up.

This summer was slightly different. I took vacation time from my FT Job. One day was the Friday of our St. John’s weekend at Chi Rho. I came to the church building to gather some things we would need (Thanks Ann for the help). When I left for Chi Rho, for some reason the GPS had me take 12 instead of 55. I was at Chi Rho last October and I know I took 55 to go west. But not one to argue with the GPS, I followed directions. As I got a little closer to Chi Rho whatever road I was on, the first building that stood out to me was on the right-hand side of this road. It had a sign that read Grace Place. About a mile later, on the left-hand side was a St. John’s Lutheran Church. God showed up to assure me that I was on the right path.

Once I arrived at Chi Rho (The new sign is NICE!) I started down the gravel road and saw the parking sign. I turned to the left and soon found myself in the correct parking area (I got lost last October). As I get out of the car, I see Oly and Dave outside along with my furry friend Cleo. As we chatted, Oly had the golf cart and helped me bring things up to the lodge that we would use for the sessions, and then I got the tour. Chi Rho is much bigger than I imagined. And it has a lot of potential.

Shortly after I started here at St. John’s, I remember Pastor Mark telling me that I needed to go out and see Chi Rho, that I was really going to like it. Then each time that I saw Brad, he would always ask me if I had been up to Chi Rho yet, to which the response was no not yet, hoping to though. After two or three times of asking me this question, Brad presented me with my own “key” to Chi Rho. From talking with these men, I got the sense that Chi Rho was something special, and I was able to see that firsthand from our weekend there.

I cannot speak for everyone, but I had an AMAZING time! I had the opportunity to talk with people more this weekend than I have since I started here. To connect with one another on a deeper level was special. I wish we could do more of that. It was like I explained in the sermon that Sunday: If connecting with people was a white chocolate mocha, on Sundays we get to the whipped cream and the drizzle of the mocha, the surface. But this weekend we were given the opportunity to get all the way to the bottom of the cup! It was a wonderful opportunity that I wish more people would have been able to take advantage of and experience.

As we have been talking about Sabbath and rest these past couple of weeks, I must confess that I enjoyed not having a television, or a good Wi-Fi signal in places at Chi Rho. On Sunday morning I woke up at about 5 AM and listened for God as I watched the sun rise. I want to go back to Chi Rho again, and again, and again.

We practiced bubble prayers and bubble blessings and walked the labyrinth. People enjoyed themselves at the campfires, enjoyed the lake, and although I could not try them for myself, Dave’s Rice Crispy Treats were the talk of the weekend!

And that is how I spent my summer vacation,

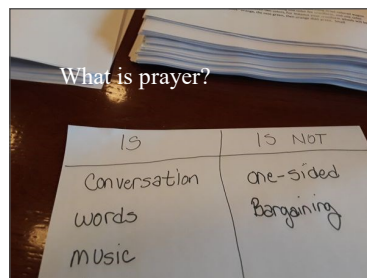

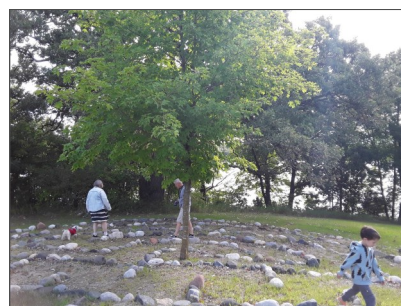

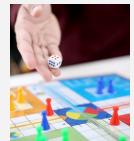
Households with children are invited to gather in Grace Place and meet your Faith Formation Companions for the coming year at Grace Place.

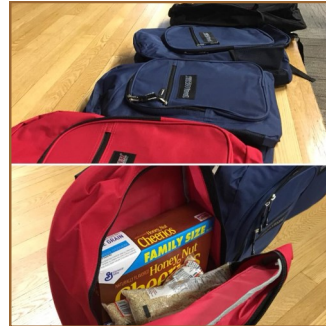
Ministry Update

Missionary Circle

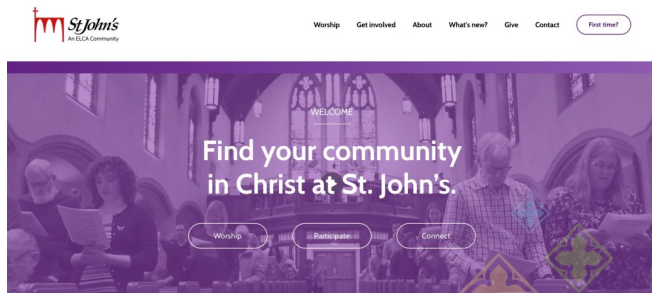
St. John's Missionary Circle will Wednesday, September 6 at noon in the church lounge. Anyone is welcome to take part in this ministry.

ADMINISTRATION

St. John's Council Meeting Highlights

August 20, 2023



Pastor's Report:

- Praised the Cross+Generational committee and Edith for its creativity and success of game night and activities.
- Encouraging are activities of CAN and our community involvement with clothing swap. Pastor has joined the Tangletown board to promote involvement in the neighborhood.
- Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices begins in October.
- Insurance claims:
 - Waiting on bid now that inspection of organ is complete.
 - Attorneys are pursuing claim for roof damage.

Treasurer's report

- Overall budget in good shape. Gross profit is at \$444,153 over budget at this point. Income is down as usual at end of summer.
- Costs are up for utilities and waste pickup.
- Continue to study putting money into a CD.
- David has been asked to detail the 435 ERC funds for council.
- Pastor asked that we consider an outside audit which is overdue.

Ministry Team Reports

- Facilities has three doors being replaced in September and concrete and blocks on steps replaced in October. Chi Rho Lodge will be painted in September.
- Missionary Circle will plan monthly collection events for men's and women's shelters.
- Cross+Gen has many activities planned including Grace Place Open House, Faith in Community Sundays, God's Work Our Hands Sunday, women's retreat and more. New meeting time second Tuesdays via Zoom.
- New website launch coming soon.

Old Business:

- A cohort of up to five people is needed for Faith Practices which begins in October. Time commitment is 3 - 5 hours a month and maybe a retreat 3 times a year. Pastor praised its success using ancient Christian devotional techniques to "connect" and "listen."
- National Night Out highly successful. Two neighborhood groups want to join us next year.

New Business

- Council voted to decide on use for Holden gift and not go with the automatic bequest protocol. Lynn Holden's letter asked that it be used for something meaningful to parents. Ideas being considered are to update camera system, put money towards a new outdoor lighted marque or put it towards a new utility vehicle at Chi Rho. Decision to be made in September.
- Council agreed monthly Temple Talks a good idea to give congregation updates, thank you's, encouragement and notices. Schedule not set.
- Pastor wants council to set some 10-year goals.
